Nurse: Hello! Greetings. Kidney Transplant.

Investigator: Hello, greetings. Is this Xi' an Jiaotong University?

Investigator: Ah, I'm from Ningxia, and I have a patient who needs a ki dney transplant and wants to be transferred over. I'd like to ask if y ou still do a lot of kidney transplants nowadays?

Nurse: Do we still do a lot of kidney transplants? Well, yeah, we're doing fine. How may I help you?

Investigator: Then, is Doctor Zheng Jin still with this hospital? Does he still work there?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Still does kidney transplant surgeries, yeah?

Investigator: As I...as I heard before the New Year, which was last year, back then he said that you've been doing a lot of cases; previously you did over 200, and now you may have been doing 300, over 300 cases.

Nurse: There are no beds available now. There are so many patients on the waiting list before you right now.

Investigator: Wow, as for your total number of beds, there are not many beds?

Nurse: The number of beds, our number of beds is okay, over 50. Why? We do not have any beds available now. Em, it's like this. If you call us, let me explain, if you want to know those details, would you please call during the day? Because I am the only nurse at night shift. We've had three or four operations done for today. I am too busy for that, I can't keep answering your questions, is that okay?

Investigator: You mean you're having three or four operations tonight?

Nurse: Is that okay? We've been doing a lot of operations. Tonight, I am the only one on duty. Is it okay for you to call tomorrow during the day? To ask more questions then?

Investigator: Yes, of course.

Nurse: I am really busy. Our patients have been ringing me non-stop. I h aven't been able to get to them yet, but instead answering your phone c all.

Investigator: I will let you go then!

Nurse: You call back tomorrow during the day, alright, Mister. If you call anytime after 8 o' clock, there will be someone answering your questions. Alright?

Investigator: Alright, alright. Thank you!

Nurse: Ah, I am so sorry, Mister.

Investigator: That's alright.

Nurse: Em, Bye.
