Investigator: Hello?

Doctor: Hello!

Investigator: Hello! Hi, is this the Beijing Chao-Yang Hospital?

Doctor: Yes. Hello?

Investigator: Hi, hello. Are you a doctor in the Liver Transplant Program?

Doctor: How can I help you?

Investigator: I'm from Hebei Province. Could I ask if Chao-Yang Hospital is still doing liver transplant surgeries?

Doctor: Oh. Yes.

Investigator: You do?

Doctor: Yeah.

Investigator: Oh. So how long would I wait to get it done after going there? The waiting time?

Doctor: Oh, that depends. Anyway, in quick cases, it takes about one or two days, but it may take half a month in other cases.

Investigator: Ah, so it won't take too long.

Doctor: Ah, that's right!

Investigator: Oh, in that case, I don't have to go there in a hurry then. Well, is Chao-Yang Hospital still doing many liver transplant surgeries now?

Doctor: Yeah, a lot.

Investigator: A lot...a lot? What do you mean by a lot? Have you done it this year?

Doctor: Yes, we have!

Investigator: Oh, you have. Well, how about the fee now? How much does it cost to have one done there?

Doctor: What?

Investigator: I mean how much it costs to get a liver transplant surgery at your place now? How much?

Doctor: It depends. It depends on the post-operative recovery. It varies from person to person.

Investigator: Chaoyang Hospital is quite famous. Can you do a few hundred liver transplants a year?

Doctor: Over one hundred.

Investigator: Over one hundred! That is to say, you already started doing liver transplant this year right after the Chinese New Year?

Doctor: Right. Yes.

Investigator: Ah, then, okay. I know people in Beijing well also. It was the Beijing Red Cross Society that recommended your hospital to me, saying that the Red Cross Society does not provide you with any liver sources. So, where do you get your livers from if they are not from the Red Cross Society?

Doctor: Oh yes, who said they were not from them?

Investigator: I've heard from the Red Cross Society, as I know a guy called Wang Chaoyang there. We are actually pretty close since I'm in the Red Cross Society as well. I'm in the Hebei Red Cross Society. He said they don't have any donations at all. So for your donors, do you acquire them by yourself? Do you get them from your own OPO? Or somewhere else?

Doctor: We get ours from them!

Investigator: From where? From Wang Chaoyang?

Doctor: Correct.

Investigator: From him?

Doctor: Across the whole country, every hospital gets them from the Red Cross Society!

Investigator: Across the entire country?

Doctor: Where else?!

Investigator: Then, then I would like to ask you: Can they find those healthy ones that they used to have, the ones from the prisoners, from Falun Gong practitioners?

Doctor: Oh...What?

Investigator: I'm saying, can you still find livers from the prisons and Falun Gong practitioners since they are all perfectly healthy with very good livers. Can you find such donors now?

Doctor: Ah, no. That's impossible.

Investigator: Impossible?

Doctor: That time has long gone.

Investigator: So your hospital used to use Falun Gong practitioners' livers, right?

Doctor: How long ago was that? That was many years ago. I'm not sure. Back then, all...

Investigator: Is that so? All right, then.

Doctor: Okay.

Investigator: So, that's about it. Well, now that patients don't have to wait for long, I'll let the patient go to your hospital as soon as possible.

Doctor: Okay, okay.

Investigator: Okay, then. Thank you. Goodbye!
