## Summary

1. We do more than 60 liver transplants each year.

- 2. We were No. 2 in terms of liver transplants in the whole province.
- 3. Now the First Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University School of Medicine is No.1 and the Second Affiliated Hospital is behind us.
- 4. In fast cases, it would be slightly over one month if you are lucky. But it could be two, three or four months, if you are not so lucky.
- 5. Investigator: Do you still have donors from Falun Gong Practitioners? Doctor: No, no, we don't have that kind.
- 6. Director Lu Caide is in charge of this area.

#### **Translation**

Doctor: Hello! This is the Hepatobiliary Surgery.

Investigator: Hi. Is this Ningbo Medical Center LiHuili Hospital?

Doctor: Yes. This is Eastern Division, Ningbo Medical Center LiHuili Hospital.

Investigator: Is Director Lu Caide there?

Doctor: The Director is in the operating room now.

Investigator: I have a relative who wants to get a liver transplant. I want to ask him if you still do many liver transplants in this hospital?

Doctor: Generally speaking, we do more than 60 liver transplants each year.

Investigator: I know you used to be No. 2 in Zhejiang Province, is that right?

Doctor: Yes, yes.

Investigator: How about Zhejiang University School of Medicine?

Doctor: What?

Investigator: Zhejiang University?

Doctor: You mean Zhejiang University School of Medicine?

Investigator: Zhejiang University School of Medicine...

Doctor: Zhejiang University has two affiliated hospitals. The First Affiliated Hospital is the number one and the Second Affiliated Hospital is behind us.

Investigator: Oh, oh, that's the case. I want to know how long I need to wait for a liver transplant if I come.

Doctor: It's hard to say. It depends on your blood type. Then we will take a look at the blood type of the liver. Perhaps you can come to the outpatient clinic and ask Doctor Lu to take a look, and consult him about your case. I cannot explain these things clearly over the phone, right?

Investigator: Right. Because my relative lives abroad, he wants me to inquire about it first before he comes back to get a liver transplant done here, you know.

Doctor: Okay. Anyways, It would be more convenient if you can come to the clinic when you are available.

Investigator: Oh. So, I'd like to let the patient know what the shortest wait time would be to get it done at your place, approximately.

Doctor: In fast cases, it would be slightly over one month if you are lucky. But it could be two, three or four months, if you are not so lucky.

Investigator: Oh, it's like that. As for the liver sources, usually are those liver donors healthy? Are they all okay?

Doctor: Definitely. Yes, we can do the surgeries usually only when they (organs) are usable for sure, right? Otherwise it makes no sense to replace them. The organs all go through evaluations.

Investigator: As I heard from doctors in our place, the patients now--(their donors) were those who were almost dying. In the past, the donors were Falun Gong practitioners in the prisons.

Doctor: We don't have that kind, no, no. I suggest that you do some research first. We can only tell you our wait time. Anyway, as I've already told you, our hospital can do over 60 cases in a year. Any other questions?

Investigator: Okay, that's it. Thank you. Bye.

Doctor: Bye.
