#### Summary

- 1. Our specialty is liver transplants, allogeneic liver transplants!
- 2. There is always a shortage of beds for transplant patients in our division.
- 3. We've done more than 100 cases since we got started, including last year, the year before...over the last three years.
- 4. As for the quantity of transplants, those 100 or so cases depend on the patients' conditions, because some patients perhaps are not suitable, we just can't do the surgeries for them.
- 5. You can have the surgery in a couple of weeks if lucky.
- 6. Here is Dr. Jiang Tieming's number: 423 199 9920 8530. His team has done quite a lot (of surgeries), with fairly mature skills.
- Investigator: So, liver sources are plentiful, relatively abundant, right? Nurse: Ah, you're asking... yes, right, regarding these things, you should (personally) ask the doctor.

## Translation

Nurse: Ah.

Investigator: Hi? Hello!

Nurse: Hi! Hello.

Investigator: Hi! Hello, hello.

Nurse: Hello.

Investigator: Is this the First Affiliated Hospital of Xinjiang Medical University?

Nurse: Ah, yes, yes.

Investigator: I'd like to consult with you regarding a liver transplant for one of my family members. Is Dr. He Tiehan still with the hospital?

Nurse: Oh, He Tiehan is not in our division!

Investigator: Which division is he in? So, you are in....

Nurse: Ah, Dr. He Tiehan is in the General Surgical Division. You're seeking to have a liver transplant surgery?

Investigator: Yes, that's right.

Nurse: Oh, I can give you the doctor's number.

Investigator: Hold on, let me get a pen.

Nurse: Oh, yes, please.

Investigator: Okay, ready. Go ahead.

Nurse: Okay...199

Investigator: 199

Nurse: 9920

Investigator: 9920

Nurse: 8530

Investigator: 8530, the doctor is...

Nurse: Doctor Jiang. It's Dr. Jiang Tieming.

Investigator: Dr. Jiang Tieming, right?

Nurse: Yes. That's right, he's on the kidney transplant team.

Investigator: He...

Nurse: You may give him a call and ask for a consultation, oh.

Investigator: How does he do as a surgeon? How are his skills?

Nurse: Ah?

Investigator: How are his skills? Are they okay?

Nurse: Yes, our specialty is in liver transplants, allogeneic liver transplants!

Investigator: Okay, then how long do we need to wait for the surgery?

Nurse: Ah...you call to consult him first. I cannot answer this question, okay?

Investigator: Do you work at the inpatient service?

Nurse: Yes, right, this is the inpatient service.

Investigator: Well then, is there any problem finding a vacant bed for admission? Can we get a bed if we come now?

Nurse: For a bed, you still need to contact the doctor first. Then you can come over directly once he gets a bed reserved for you.

Investigator: Oh, it sounds like there is a shortage of beds at your hospital, so reservation is needed, right?

Nurse: Yes, that's right. There is always a shortage of beds for transplant patients in our division.

Investigator: Oh, I see, that means that many surgeries have been done, right?

Nurse: Ah.. (that's because) techniques are relatively mature. For more specific questions, you would better ask Dr. Jiang Tieming.

Investigator: So we can draw this conclusion that if many surgeries have been done here, then your technical skills must be remarkable and reliable, right?

Nurse: Ah, we've done more than 100 kidney transplant surgeries!

Investigator: Oh, were those surgeries done in one month?

Nurse: Ah, to date, we've done more than 100 cases since we got started, including last year, the year before...over the last three years.

Investigator: Oh, then how many (liver transplant) cases approximately can you do in one month?

Nurse: Those one hundred or so cases depend on the patients' conditions, because some patients perhaps are not suitable, we just can't do the surgeries for them. We can only perform the surgeries when we have patients who meet all the requirements with suitable medical conditions. It's not like whoever comes asking for a liver transplant can get one done, or whoever needs a liver transplant can have one as he or she wishes.

Investigator: Yes, you're right, we're suitable (for the surgery)

Investigator: We have all of our examinations completed. My friend told me that it is quicker to get the surgery done in your hospital, so we are considering it. If you tell me that we can have the surgery done in one to two weeks, we will come to you immediately.

Nurse: Ah.

Investigator: Yes, so can we have the surgery done in a couple of weeks?

Nurse: Ah, that's not far off! The important thing is that previous examinations are completed, everything looks alright, and there are no problems with the assessment, then he (the patient) can be admitted.

Investigator: Oh, so your liver sources are plentiful, relatively abundant, right?

Nurse: Ah, you're asking..., yes, right, regarding these things, you should (personally) ask the doctor.

Investigator: We know...we hope we can have a liver source of good quality. We're willing to pay more if necessary, it does not matter. Regarding the liver sources, what kind of liver sources are there at your hospital? What conditions are they (the liver sources) in?

Nurse: Oh, you're asking such professional questions. You should ask the doctor later. I just gave you his number. Go ask him.

Investigator: Of course, I'm quite professional, since I've already checked with several doctors and hospitals. My friend recommended your place for the liver resources.

Nurse: Yes, yes. I know, but as I work at the inpatient service, I can only speak to you as a nurse. For more detailed information, it is more appropriate to ask the doctor because that's beyond my knowledge.

Investigator: However, to use his cell number you just gave me, I can call him only in the daytime, as it is better not to disturb him as he needs rest during the night. That is why I....

Nurse: Ah, it's okay! Call him now, it's okay, just go call him now, it's fine.

Investigator: Oh, isn't he in bed now?

Nurse: Yes, it's fine, go call him now, it is okay.

Investigator: Is there a doctor on duty at your place? Is there a doctor on duty there?

Nurse: The doctor on duty here is not specialized in this field (kidney transplant).

Investigator: Oh.

Nurse: If I tell you these things, what if I can only give incomplete information, missing this or that?

Investigator: Oh, Dr. Jiang Tieming, as you recommended, is very professional.

Nurse: Yes, that's right. We're on the same team doing the surgeries, so the techniques of the team are quite mature. As he and his team have done a lot(of surgeries), you go ask him to get a better idea of what you have to ask about, okay?

Investigator: Okay, I'll contact him first. I'll check back with you if I cannot find him, all right? I still need to get a few things figured out. Thank you!

Nurse: Oh, yes, all right.

Investigator: Thanks, bye!
