### Summary

- 1. Bring over his files for us to take a look first. The patient does not need to come this time.

## Translation

Investigator: Hello?

Nurse: Hello?

Investigator: Hi, hello! Is this Liver Transplant at the First Affiliated Hospital of Anhui Medical University?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: I just called a moment ago, so, is the professor back now?

Nurse: How can I help you? Please speak.

Investigator: Well, my husband wants to get transferred to your hospital for a liver transplant. How should we proceed? Should I just bring his files to you first or does my husband need to come with me?

Nurse: Wait for a minute, let me find you a doctor here.

Investigator: Okay, thanks.

(Waiting)

Doctor: Hello!

Investigator: Hi, how are you?

Doctor: Hello! Please speak, go ahead!

Investigator: Here's my situation. My husband wants to...as my classmate recommended this hospital to us, we'd like to get my husband transferred here for a liver transplant. His case is quite urgent. Should I just bring you his files for you to take a look first, or along with the patient as well?

Doctor: No, no, you can just bring his files here for us to take a look first. As we're in the surgical division, the patient won't get transferred here if the condition is serious, do you understand?

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor: If you need a consultation, you can come either tomorrow morning or the morning after tomorrow and bring his files for us to take a look first. Where is he hospitalized now?

Investigator: He's in Hefei, at the Second People's Hospital of Hefei.

Doctor: In Hefei. What is it that's bothering him? Is it liver failure, or what?

Investigator: Ah, it's a hepatic tumor—it's rather serious.

Doctor: Well, you can bring his files for us to take a look either tomorrow or the day after.

Investigator: Which doctor should I look for? Can I have your name, your last name please?

Doctor: Don't worry about that. Just come ask for one of our doctors directly at the inpatient service.

Investigator: To come ask for one right at the inpatient service? Okay. Well, my classmate recommended Zhao Yijun or Geng Xiaoping to me.

Doctor: That's Zhao Hongchuan, Director Zhao.

Investigator: Oh, that's Director Zhao, instead?

Doctor: Yes, that's right. Director Zhao, Zhao Hongchuan.

Investigator: I thought that was Zhao Yijun, as I was told so.

Doctor: He isn't in our division-he doesn't do liver transplant surgeries.

Investigator: Oh, I see, okay. So, I'll bring you his files then. If he is suitable for the surgery, as his case is urgent, how soon...can it be arranged and done in half a month or one month?

Doctor: I don't know, as that can't be arranged. How could I arrange a surgery without a liver organ? You see what I mean? While waiting for a liver organ, one patient may get it in a couple of days, while another may still end up with nothing even having waited for a couple of years. Do you understand?

Investigator: Oh, but it (a liver organ) may become available in a couple of days in the fastest case, right?

Doctor: Yes, it may become available any time, that's right. But sometimes, perhaps nothing shows up after the patient has waited for three months, five months or even half a year. Generally, many patients need to acquire liver sources. You got my point?

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor: Many patients are on the waiting list here. To put it briefly, ah, let's make it brief: you can come visit our division if you want to, okay?

Doctor: I'm in the middle of something at the moment, and I'll talk to you later, okay?

Investigator: Okay, I'll bring you his files for you to take a look tomorrow.

Doctor: Let's do that then.
