Summary

- 1. In the fastest cases, patients come in today and their operations are done tomorrow. In slow cases, the wait times can be a year or two.
- 2. We do about 100 operations a year at our hospital.
- 3. This technique has been used for a few decades.
- 4. The surgeries are usually performed by the director.

Translation

Doctor: Hello, greetings!

Investigator: Hello, greetings! Is this Ruikang Hospital Affiliated to Guangxi University of Chinese Medicine?

Doctor: En, Ruikang Hospital.

Investigator: Greeting's. My family name is Zhao. I am from Shenyang. I have a family member doing business in your Nanning area. He is suffering from kidney failure, and is hospitalized there. He's gone through his tissue tying, and everything is okay. But he's waited for two months in that hospital.

Doctor: Eh, how can I help you?

Investigator: Ah, as I just said, he's waited in line for two months, for a kidney transplant. The doctor there suggested that we make a few phone calls to other hospitals, or visit them, to see which has faster queues.

Doctor: Where is he waiting now? Where did he get his tissue typing done? Where?

Investigator: He is in a hospital in Nanning. I know the city's name, but not sure about the rest. I've never been there. I've never been to Guangxi.

Doctor: If he wants to get it done over here, he has to wait here as well. It depends on his matching results. It's not like if you are in a hurry, we can get the operation done in a month or a few days. It's not just an operation, isn't it? After the operation, there are still many issues, aren't there? Kidney transplantation is not like, oh, you get the operation done and then everything is okay, isn't it? There are many postoperative issues, aren't there? Many issues exist!

Investigator: Oh, thank you.

Doctor: If he wants to get the operation done, if he wants to come here, you can ask him to join our waiting list. Just wait here.

Investigator: So I think, if we are lucky—we try our best to do it well, but also should be cautious of the problems—if we are lucky, meaning in the fastest case, how soon can a matching donor be found and the operation be done, according to your experience?

Doctor: For these things, let me tell you, it is hard to say. In the fastest case here, the patient got admitted into the hospital one day, right on the next day there came a suitable kidney for him and he got it done, and the result was pretty good. Some waited a year or two with nothing available, and still had to keep on waiting. Such things are hard to say. Okay?

Investigator: Oh, oh. Your hospital's skills are no problem, right? Skills? The more you do, the better your skills. Is it fair to say that?

Doctor: Ah, that is not a problem. Where are you? Shenyang?

Investigator: I am from Shenyang. Yes.

Doctor: There in Shenyang, there is a military hospital. In the past, their director often referred us to their patients to come over. Okay?

Investigator: Who are you talking about, Shen Zhongyang?

Doctor: Yes yes. Shen Zhongyang, a military doctor.

Investigator: Yes. So, as for the experience and everything else, the experience is the most important. Also the donor is very important. Just these two points. As the doctor told us, your hospital does it every day? Or how many do you do in a month? So, I think if you do a lot, the skills will be no problem. How many can your hospital do in a year?

Doctor: We don't do that many.

Investigator: Oh, not that many. But how about your success rate? I may sound like a layman or rude, so please forgive me. If it fails, it's not going to fail immediately, is it? It can be seen and made up by a remedy measure, can it? Because it is the kidney, unlike the heart.

Doctor: There are many questions as such. What you are saying is too general. Okay? Let him come, and I will talk to him in detail, if there are any questions. Okay?

Investigator: Oh, oh. But regarding the skills, we are still concerned. I am sorry. In a year, you can do a hundred, there should be a hundred?

Doctor: En, roughly in that range. This technique's been used for a few decades. It is not a big deal. No problem. Okay?

Investigator: Oh, that is fine. So doctor, are you a chief surgeon?

Doctor: Usually the director does all the surgeries.

Investigator: Oh, the director does that. So what is the director's name? Could you tell me?

Doctor: Ah, you come over, let him come over. Ah, well, that's about it, okay?

Investigator: Okay, fine. That's fine. Thank you. Thanks!
