Summary

- 1. Wang Zhengxin is our director. He does liver transplants.
- 2. At our hospital here, we had patients who got (their transplants) done in three days; we also had those who waited for a month.
- 3. Investigator: Do you still have that kind of organs from Falun Gong practitioners now? Nurse: I do not know. You can ask one of the doctors, okay?.... Do not ask that kind (of questions) anymore.
- Investigator: I just want to get it done using that kind of organs from Falun Gong practitioners. Nurse: You go ask the doctor. I cannot answer this question for you!
- 5. If it is completely smooth, the patient can be released from the hospital in two weeks.

Translation

Nurse: Hi, how are you?

Investigator: Hi. How are you? I would like to ask a question. Is this Liver Transplant Inpatient Service at Huashan Hospital affiliated to Fudan University?

Nurse: Ah.

Investigator: Ah, here's my situation. Because I'd like to transfer my family member to your hospital to do a liver transplant...

Nurse: Okay, okay. Please just wait a moment.

(Another person picking up the phone)

Nurse: Hello?

Investigator: Hi, how are you? It is like this. Well, one of my family members has been diagnosed with late stage cirrhosis lately. I want to transfer him to your hospital to have a liver transplant.

Nurse: You need to contact a doctor. Come on Monday to find a doctor.

Investigator: Which doctor shall I look for?

Nurse: Have you seen anyone here before? You need to come to the outpatient clinic!

Investigator: But I don't know which doctor does the liver transplants in your hospital!

Nurse: For a liver transplant, it must be Wang Zhengxin!

Investigator: Oh, Wang Zhengxin. Is it Wang Zhengxin, Director Wang?

Nurse: Yeah.

Investigator: I go to the outpatient clinic to make an appointment with Director Wang, and then say we want a liver transplant.

Nurse: Right.

Investigator: Then I want to ask a question. In your hospital, for a liver transplant, eh, do you know how long (a patient) needs to wait?

Nurse: That's hard to say. There has to be a liver for him before it can be done.

Investigator: Right. If it is fast, can (the transplant) be done in about a month?

Nurse: That's something I cannot guarantee.

Investigator: Okay, while in the inpatient service, have you had such patients who were able to get (the transplants) done in a month? Because now I want to get onto the waiting lists of several more hospitals to see which one can...

Nurse: At our hospital here, we had patients who got (their transplants) done in three days; we also had those who waited a month.

Investigator: Oh. That is good! I got the idea now. Then I want to ask you something. Originally, my neighbor referred to me Director Qian, called Qian Jianmin. Is he still there?

Nurse: Anyway, he is not in our inpatient service.

Investigator: Director Qian isn't in your inpatient service?

Nurse: How many years ago did your neighbor have the liver transplant done?

Investigator: Ah, about five or six years ago.

Nurse: Right. Now there are different people. (Different) doctors!

Investigator: Oh, Director Qian is no longer there, then...

Nurse: He does not do liver transplantation anymore!

Investigator: He does not do it anymore, right? Well, here's my question. As he said back then, the liver source he found, the liver he used for transplantation, was from someone who practiced Falun Gong. Do we still have that kind of organs?

Nurse: I do not know. You can ask one of the doctors, okay? You come here to see a doctor first. Do not ask that kind (of questions) anymore.

Investigator: Right. That's because I feel that kind of organs do work well! We also want to have a transplant organ from those who practice (Falun) Gong. Is that possible?

Nurse: I cannot guarantee what kind of livers you'll get.

Investigator: What kind of livers can't you guarantee? Well, how can I've heard people say that? I just want to get it done using that kind of organs from those Falun Gong practitioners.

Nurse: You go and ask the doctor. I cannot answer this question for you! What does it mean that it cannot be done without a Falun Gong's liver? This is not to replace his brain!

Investigator: I want to ask the last question. If we get the surgery done here, how long shall the patient need to stay in the hospital before he can be discharged?

Nurse: As for his hospital discharge, it depends on his postoperative recovery. Those things cannot be clearly spelled out.

Investigator: (What is) the normal situation like?

Nurse: Normally, if it is completely smooth, he can be released from the hospital in two weeks. You can talk to the doctor about those things, okay?

Investigator: Ask the doctor...okay. Thank you!
