Translation

President Qi Zhongquan: Hello!

Investigator: Hi, greetings. Is this Qi Zhongquan?

President Qi Zhongquan: Who's this?

Investigator: Greetings. It's like this. Are you working with Zhongshan Hospital of

Xiamen University? Are you still there?

President Qi Zhongquan: I've moved to another job.

Investigator: Oh, you're no longer with that hospital?

President Qi Zhongquan: No, I'm not. I no longer work there. That was our affiliated hospital. No longer working there, I always have been working with the current medical school instead.

Investigator: Oh, you work with the medical school, not with Zhongshan Hospital of Xiamen University?

President Qi Zhongquan: We've never done that while I was at Zhongshan Hospital of Xiamen University. But now they've recently started doing it at Xiang'an Hospital of Xiamen University.

Investigator: Which hospital are you talking about? Which hospital of Xiamen University?

President Qi Zhongquan: It's Xiang'an Hospital, a newly established one. Before that, none of the hospitals at Xiamen University were qualified to do it.

Investigator: Oh, you mean Xiang'an Hospital, right?

President Qi Zhongquan: Yes.

Investigator: Oh, are you saying that's the only hospital that does it in Xiamen?

President Qi Zhongquan: Only recently, they've done two cases this year.

Investigator: Only two cases have been done this year?

President Qi Zhongquan: They did not have the qualifications before, none of them did. As I came back after I finished my studies in Sweden, that was ten years ago. I used to do it in Sweden. After coming back, I found no hospitals had the qualifications in Xiamen, so I did not do it then.

Investigator: You now have moved to Guangxi, no longer in Xiamen...

President Qi Zhongquan: Right, not in Xiamen.

Investigator: Oh, you've been relocated to Guangxi. So can we go to your place? Do you do transplantation at your current hospital?

President Qi Zhongquan: No, I don't do it here, either.

Investigator: You don't either?

President Qi Zhongquan: Because I've been back from overseas for over ten years, I no longer perform operations, and mainly do education in medicine.

Investigator: Oh, well, did you do it in Sweden, liver transplantation? If we...

President Qi Zhongquan: No, in Sweden we did kidney transplantation.

Investigator: Oh, you did kidney transplantation?

President Qi Zhongquan: It is well regulated in Sweden, it's well regulated there. They all use donated organs.

Investigator: Oh, that's right. The hospitals say the wait times for the operations are quite short, as short as a week. So I think...

President Qi Zhongquan: No, no. Now in China since September of 2015—they used to use those or whatever—now they've all been using donated organs.

Investigator: Oh...those ...

President Qi Zhongquan: They've stopped using those death inmates' organs for quite a long time already.

Investigator: So those death inmates, or...

President Qi Zhongquan: No, now whoever uses those will lose his or her doctor's license. They are no longer allowed, and forbidden by law.

Investigator: But...

President Qi Zhongquan: They've been banned since 2015, according to the regulations by the state or the Health Planning Commission.
