Investigator: Hello! I'd like to ask about a liver transplant, as we need to get one done. Could you let me know what procedure to follow? Doctor: Here for a liver transplant, uh, you'd better come on Wednesdays, as Director Lu Caide comes to the outpatient clinic on Wednesdays. (You can bring) the reports, those test reports. And if the patient can still walk around, you'd better bring the patient along. Director Lu Caide is available at the outpatient clinic on Wednesday mornings.

Investigator: Ah, okay. So, I'm wondering if we wait, what's the shortest wait time there, in the fastest case?

Doctor: In the fastest case? It depends entirely on your luck. In faster cases, sometimes it may take two or three months to get the tissue typing done if lucky. If not so lucky, it may take half a year, but that's hard to say.

Investigator: Oh.

Doctor: That depends on, firstly, the patient's blood type, and secondly, his or her medical condition, or how serious it is.

Investigator: Okay.

Doctor: In some, in some faster cases, the wait time may be just two or three months. However, in some slower cases, that could be hard to say, sometimes it's possible for patients to keep waiting and end up with nothing.

Investigator: His blood type is B. Is that fast?

Doctor: Blood Type B?

Investigator: Yeah.

Doctor: In that case, I don't know about blood type B. I will ask about it when the time comes.

Investigator: Okay. I'd like to know how much we need to prepare.

Doctor: About the money, it could be, it should be about 500,000 yuan, somewhere between 300,000 and 500,000 yuan.

Investigator: Oh, oh, in the range of 300,000 to 500,000 yuan.

Doctor: Yes, that's right.

Investigator: So, you're a designated COVID-19 hospital, are you?

Doctor: Oh, no. We, that is, at our hospital, we've basically cleared out all COVID-19 patients. Normally we don't accept any patients with COVID-19 at our hospital. If there

are such patients identified, we have a separate place for quarantine. For some patients, we just send them to other hospitals directly.

Investigator: Ah, okay, that means this hospital still accepts patients during the epidemic?

Doctor: Yes.

Investigator: You've been always doing it, right?

Doctor: Ah, yes, that's right.

Investigator: Oh, how many cases can Director Lu do in a year?

Doctor: Director Lu In a year?
