Doctor Liu: It is Dan, as in Danqing.

Doctor Liu: Think about it, our hospital has been doing liver transplants since 2002.

Investigator: Ah...you're been doing it since 2002? Oh, well, how many cases did you do last year? I mean how many did Director Xu perform last year?

Doctor Liu: About 50 to 60, or over 60 cases of liver transplants should be done last year.

Investigator: Ah, over 60 cases. Oh, that's good. So, how many hospitals do it in Jiangxi Province?

Doctor Liu: Both the First Affiliated Hospital and the Second Affiliated Hospital (of Nan Chang University) also do it.

Doctor Liu: For your wait time in the queue, that, that's a different matter when it comes to organ transplants.

Investigator: Oh, that depends on luck, right?

Doctor Liu: My family name is Liu.

Investigator: Okay, it's Liu, alright, Doctor Liu.
