- 4. Last year there were three allogeneic transplant cases performed.
- 5. All liver sources were from other places (non-local). A team of experts from West China Hospital of Sichuan University came and did the transplants.
- 6. Now none (of the livers) come from the judicial system, and since 2015, those from executed prisoners have not been allowed.

Translation

Investigator: Hello!

Doctor: Hi!

Investigator: Hi there, is this Qinghai Provincial People's Hospital? Sorry I was cut off.

Doctor: Oh, please hold.

(Changed to another male Doctor)

Doctor: Hi, how are you?

Investigator: Hi there.

Doctor: Hum.

Investigator: My relative wants to have a liver transplant. Before the pandemic, he had his tissue typing done, but due to pandemic he postponed it. Now he wants to have it done again.

Doctor: Oh, you are, from Qinghai? Or....

Investigator: Ah, yes, he is, he is...for almost 20 years, over there.

Doctor: Oh, then he needs to come here, first needs to book a liver source.

Investigator: Ah, book a liver source, about that evaluation, do you still need it?

Doctor: Yes.

Investigator: About the tissue typing, does it need to be re-done? It's not needed, right? Can we just give you that original report?

Doctor: Yes, yes, please bring it, bring it over, we need to put it in our computer system.

Investigator: If things are smooth, if he gets registered on the waiting list, will he get the surgery done within a month?

Doctor: (He) needs to come here, to meet our Director responsible for liver transplants, our Director Ye.

Investigator: Ah, then Director Ye, he is the lead surgeon, right?

Doctor: Oh, overall the several cases here were like that, the livers came from other areas, then the experts from West China Hospital of Sichuan University came and did them.

Investigator: That Ye...Director Ye, what's his name?

Doctor: Ye...Ye Chengjie. I can give you his cell phone number, so you directly call his...call his cell phone.

Investigator: Ah, okay, please tell me.

Investigator: 2107, okay, I guess this Director Ye is, is the one who does (transplants) the most and the best, right?

Doctor: Because he... now he is Director of Transplant, appointed by the Health Department of Qinghai Province.

Investigator: Ah.

Doctor: Thus for all things related to transplantation, please contact him.

Investigator: But he is only in charge of this hospital, or there are many other hospitals?

Doctor: He... because in Qinghai Province, we are the only hospital capable of doing liver transplants. In our Qinghai Province there are two major hospitals, the other one is (Qinghai University) Affiliated Hospital, but Affiliated Hospital is not qualified for liver transplants.

Investigator: Ah, ah.

Doctor: So they can't do liver transplants.

Investigator: Ah.

Doctor: Yes, last year our hospital did total three cases, or?

Investigator: how many, 13 cases?

Doctor: Last year the whole year we did three cases of allogeneic transplants, then there were also autologous transplants. We also did autologous transplants--those were mainly for liver fluke. Total five or six cases last year. You can contact him. When the time is due, for example, as the liver source is ready, they will...our experts, who are from West China Hospital as a medical team, will come.

Investigator: Ah.

Doctor: (They) will come do the surgery.

Investigator: Ah, ah...okay, I'd like say: the shorter the wait time the better.

Doctor: The wait time in general needs half a month to one month, so you need to contact Director Ye, contact him.

Investigator: Ah, ah, okay, please let me know roughly how much it costs.

Doctor: Total cost? You need at least 300,000 yuan.

Investigator: Ah, 300,000, 300,000 yuan....

Doctor: Uh, uh...the liver source....

Investigator: Is that for the liver source?

Doctor: For this liver overall, you need to first prepare this much, the overall cost...

Investigator: Ah, the total cost is 300,000 yuan.

Doctor: In Beijing or Shanghai, they usually charge 400,000 or 500,000 yuan, right?

Investigator: Ah, sure. Then what I'm mostly concerned is the quality (of liver), don't use the one... such as (the organs) from those who are unhealthy or seriously ill, how about that? I don't know how you would control the quality.

Doctor: About the quality I tell you, it is surely, for example, the donations usually are the ones from those who died from car accidents or became brain dead.

Investigator: Ah.

Doctor: I mean those that are healthy, in good health.

Investigator: Ah, I want to say if it could be done in one month, that'd be nice.

Doctor: That can't be guaranteed.

Investigator: Ah, can't be guaranteed?

Doctor: Can't be guaranteed in one month.

Investigator: Ah, it can't be guaranteed, but it's possible?

Doctor: First, contact our Director Ye.

Investigator: Ah, okay. Then I want to ask, as my friend told me, his relative had it (the surgery) done here. So he suggested that I check with you here. His relative got a good quality (organ), he said that came from the judicial system, no need to spend more money, etc. He said....

Doctor: Yes, but right now there is none from the judicial system.

Investigator: Ah, none, he told me to talk to one of you doctors.

Doctor: Now none (of the livers) come from the judicial system. Since 2015, those from executed prisoners have not been allowed. Now they're all from donations.

Investigator: Ah, those have been banned since 2015?

Doctor: Yes, yes.

Investigator: Okay then, thank you, thank you.

Doctor: Okay.

Investigator: Okay, thanks you.
