Summary

1. "They first sign up here when still being alive, but now nobody has donated (an organ) yet. They have to wait until they die to donate organs. We must all wait." "No actual donation yet." "It is also possible to sign up at a very young age, and then we can only wait until their final moments."

2. "So for (an organ) from someone with cancer, you wouldn't use it even if he is willing to donate."

3. There are people that have the intention to donate their organs, but there are not many of them.

4. "As of now in our Qinhuangdao area, there are no liver or heart donations, even no place to accept such donations."

(The official media reported on April 2, 2015 that there were only 14 successful organ donation cases in Hebei Province from June 2013 to date, and the Red Cross Society obtained 35 vital organs for transplants.)

Phone Investigation Recording

Investigator: Is that the Red Cross Society's organ donation office?

Red Cross Staff: How may I help you?

Investigator: Do you have any donated organs here?

Red Cross Staff: No, we just started organ and body donations.

Investigator: Right. Now do you have anyone who donates?

Red Cross staff: There are people who have signed up.

Investigator: Is there anyone who has donated an organ here?

Red Cross staff: Whom am I speaking to?

Investigator: I have a patient in need of a kidney. Do you have someone who donated it? Red Cross staff: They first sign up here when still being alive, but now nobody has donated (an organ) yet. They have to wait until they die to donate organs. We must all wait. Investigator: Oh, only donation after their death?

Red Cross staff: Right, right, right. Nobody (donated).

Investigator: Not yet?

Red Cross staff: No actual donation yet.

Investigator: All have to wait to donate after death, right?

Red Cross staff: Right, right, right.

Investigator: But the doctor said that after their death, their organs would not be good to use.

Red Cross staff: But we can only have donations after death at the Red Cross Society. Investigator: Donation after death?

Red Cross staff: Yes, donation after death.

Investigator: Oh.

Red Cross staff: Organ donation when the donor is still alive is illegal. We don't have that here, either.

Investigator: The doctor said that if the donor has indeed died, the organ wouldn't be good to use? The effect is not very good?

Red Cross staff: They are talking from the medical treatment perspective, but we only have donations after death. This donation will not necessarily be usable. For example, if (the donor) is a sick person, it is impossible to use his or her organs.

Investigator: So do you have such donations after death?

Red Cross staff: There are people who have signed up, but have not donated yet.

Investigator: There are people who have signed up, are there many of them?

Red Cross staff: Some have the intention.

Investigator: Are there many of them?

Red Cross staff: Not many.

Investigator: Not many?

Red Cross staff: Not many.

Investigator: After cornea donation, won't they also lose their eyes?

Red Cross Staff: Well that would be ... donations after death.

Investigator: kidneys are okay? It is not easy to get livers or hearts, right?

Red Cross Staff: As of now in our Qinhuangdao area, there are no liver or heart

donations, even no place to accept such donations, nor

Investigator: So nobody donates it, nobody accepts it.

Red Cross staff: Right, right, right. It is only kidneys, corneas as well as remains, these three things.

Investigator: So for corneas and kidneys, are there people who have signed up for donation?

Red Cross staff: Yes, yes.

Investigator: Do they intend to donate their organs to their family members, or just anyone who needs the organ can get it?

Red Cross staff: Right, anyone. It means that he/she agrees to donate, and the hospital will arrange for it.

Red Cross staff: For those who indeed have agreed to donate, the organs cannot be used at all at that time.

Investigator: Can't be used?

Red Cross Staff: Right, such as someone with cancer, you cannot use his/her organs at

all.

Investigator: Right, even if he agreed to donate, it cannot be used.

Red Cross Staff: But corneas are good.

Investigator: So from someone with cancer, you wouldn't use it even if he is willing to donate.

Red Cross Staff: Right, right. If you give it to someone, who needs a transplant, what if there is canceration? What can you do?

Investigator: We don't dare to use it.

Red Cross staff: Hospitals won't accept it, either.

Investigator: Kidney donation faces the same situation, that is, it is still not very smooth, not feasible, right?

Red Cross staff: Then we just take it easy, but there are people, who have signed up. Investigator: But if nobody dares to use the donated organs, what's to be done?

Red Cross staff: Those six people, who signed up, did so when they were young, nobody knows their final state.

Investigator: (both laugh) If nobody knows what may happen in the end, who will do it? Red Cross staff: It is also possible to sign up at a very young age, and then we can only wait until their final moments.

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Investigator: You are the Qinhuangdao (Red Cross Society), so every city should have a donation office?

Red Cross staff: Right, right.

Investigator: I heard there were very few donations.

Red Cross staff: Yes. Some have signed up now, you have to wait for (an organ after death). It takes some time.

Investigator: There are people, who have signed up. They have to wait after death? Wait when they have an accident...

Red Cross staff: Right, right, donation after death.
