Summary

1. It would be best if you could come see us in person. It is not appropriate nor convenient to discuss with me through a phone call.
2. My last name is Wu, and I can also do the surgeries.
3. Please write down my cell number: 139 2098 956.
4. Investigator: Could you please find me a practitioner donor?
Doctor Wu: I do not have a say on such a matter!
5. We do not currently have those. They are all acquired *via* an unified allocation.
6. Organ-related questions require a face-to-face meeting.
7. We have not just livers; we have everything you might need!

Translation

Investigator: Hi, hello! How did the call get disconnected? Is this the liver transplant inpatient service at Tianjin First Central Hospital? Excuse me?

Nurse: Hello? Pardon me, I could not hear what you were saying clearly.

Investigator: Oh, are you part of the liver transplant inpatient service at Tianjin First Central Hospital? Is that right?

Nurse: We have not just liver; we have everything you might need.

Investigator: Everything I might need. May I speak with the doctor on duty there?

Nurse: Sure, what happened?

Investigator: Could you help me find a doctor on duty, so I can ask him a few questions, alright?

Nurse: Are you seeking information regarding a liver transplant? Have you been hospitalized here before? You were here before, were you?

Investigator: Right. Previously, not my husband, but one of my relatives came here. His surgery was very successful. He has been doing well since the surgery. Thus, he recommended this hospital to me. So I would like to get some more detailed information. When do you think I can schedule a surgery?

Nurse: Please wait!

Investigator: Okay. Thanks.

(Waiting for a doctor...)

Investigator: Hi? Hello? How are you?

Dr. Wu: Hello, hi!

Investigator: May I ask who I am speaking to?

Dr. Wu: Uh, my last name is Wu. How can I help you? Please go ahead!

Investigator: Oh, one of my friends had a successful liver transplant here. Now, my husband has end-stage liver cirrhosis. We are considering a liver transplant, so I would like to ask a few questions. First of all, this surgery can be performed here, right? Are there donors available?

Dr. Wu: What?

Investigator: I mean a liver organ. My husband needs to get his liver replaced.

Dr. Wu: Hum.

Investigator: Just like a friend of mine...last time, Dr. Deng did the surgery for him, it was very successful, and my friend has been doing well since then. I wonder if Dr. Deng is still working there.

Dr. Wu: He's not here now.

Investigator: Then, then in your hospital...

Dr. Wu: Where are you calling from?

Investigator: I'm from Zhejiang.

Dr. Wu: Zhejiang?

Investigator: Right. Well, which doctor, besides Dr. Deng, does a good job? We, we run our own business, money is not an issue. So first and foremost, we need a good doctor. Secondly, we need a high-quality organ.

Dr. Wu: Oh...

Investigator; Could you recommend a doctor for us?

Dr. Wu: It would be best if you could come see us in person. It is not appropriate nor convenient to discuss this through a phone call. If I simply tell you that I'm the technical skillful surgeon, would you believe me? It would be best if you could come visit the clinic to see it for yourself in person.

Investigator: If we come to the clinic, we don't know which doctor to speak to about my husband's case. Which doctor should we ask for?

Dr. Wu: Where is this patient now? He should visit here often; I think he would get to know our place as well.

Investigator: Yes. He has come often. First, he'd like to find Dr. Deng, a surgeon with that last name Deng. There was another one with the last name Zheng. No matter Deng or Zheng, whatever, both are quite experienced and skillful. Is any one of them still there?

Dr. Wu: Yes. You can find this information on our website.

Investigator: Sure. I can check online. We would like to get him transferred over to your place. How long would he need to wait for the surgery if he comes over?

Dr. Wu: It is hard to say.

Investigator: My friend told me that his surgery was done quickly, and a matched organ was found within two weeks. We would like to have the surgery done as soon as possible. Money is not an issue.

Dr. Wu: It depends on the situation.

Investigator: We can't afford a delay; he needs to get the surgery done as soon as possible.

Dr. Wu: Huh.

Investigator: Are you saying you can't?

Dr. Wu: No, but we must follow the procedure.

Investigator: Then I will bring you all of his medical records, his medical files, everything. Will that work?

Dr. Wu: If you're alright with it, I can see him. You can also directly contact....

Investigator: May I have your last name please?

Dr. Wu: My last name is Wu.

Investigator: Last name Wu, the same Wu with "kou" and "tian" (talking about the Chinese character)?

Dr. Wu: Yes. Correct.

Investigator: May I have your cell number?

Dr. Wu: Huh...

Investigator: 139

Dr. Wu: 2098

Investigator: 2098, next.

Dr. Wu: 9565

Investigator: 9565, yes?

Dr. Wu: Yes. Correct.

Investigator: Oh, your last name is Wu, right? Dr. Wu, one more question, you are telling me that you can do it, right?

Dr. Wu: Right, right.

Investigator: Great, let me ask one more important question. The technical skills of the surgeon are critical. But as my friend told me, the most critical part is the quality of the

donor. So could you find me a qigong practitioner donor, because those practitioners are quite healthy. (Dr. Wu: Ha, ha) Could you find me a practitioner? As a donor? Hello! Dr. Wu, Dr. Wu!

Dr. Wu: Huh.

Investigator: I just, I'll just have to ask you for your help with this important issue when we come looking for you next time. My friend told me that the quality of the donor is the most critical. Well, the technical skills of the surgeon are also important, and the quality of the donor is critical too. My friend's donor was a practitioner who was quite healthy. I wonder, if I pay a little more, could you find me a practitioner donor?

Dr. Wu: (laughter) I do not have a say on such a matter, that is....

Investigator: I was told that the surgeons can find quality donors, particularly practitioners.

Dr. Wu: No, we can't.

Investigator: But my friend said so. So, you really cannot find any?

Dr. Wu: It requires state registration and they (the donors) are acquired *via* an unified allocation nationwide.

Investigator: My friend said that the surgeons can find that kind of donors quickly, really quickly, and they all are Falun Gong practitioners. Can you help me find such a donor?

Dr. Wu: We can't find one, we can't find one of those.

Investigator: You can't?

Dr. Wu: No, we can't.

Investigator: Well, I was told that such a donor is the best.

Dr. Wu: They are all allocated (nationwide), all are *via* an unified allocation, all are *via* an unified allocation.

Investigator: What if we get an organ from an elderly donor. What do we do if we are assigned a poor-quality donor?

Dr. Wu: What we give you should be good in quality.

Investigator: As I have been telling you, money is not an issue. Dr. Wu, don't worry about the price; I need quality assurance. Please make every effort to guarantee that. I will bring in the medical records, hope you can do the surgery as soon as possible.

Dr. Wu: I cannot promise what you are asking for, I cannot. Okay?

Investigator: Well, as you said, you do that every day—those surgeries every day. My friend said you surgeons here are very resourceful, and have relatively abundant organ sources. He told me I must speak with you. We had already planned to do the surgery over there, but he insisted that I speak with you, or someone in your hospital, there could be practitioner donors, those Falun Gong practitioners who are in jail for practicing Falun Gong...

Dr. Wu: We currently absolutely do not have those things...Let me tell you this, there are no such things; all of our donors are all from the brain-dead victims and they are all obtained through the unified allocation nationwide.

Investigator: What happens if we receive one of poor quality, what do we do? We wouldn't be able to tell because the organ is put inside. How would I know the surgery is successful?

Dr. Wu: All right, I have explained so much to you already. About that, we will need to discuss in a face-to-face meeting, and you can bring over all of your files, okay?

Investigator: I am counting on you to make every effort possible, alright?

Dr. Wu: Huh, alright.

Investigator: Good, thank you very much, thank you. So, there is no problem finding a vacant bed at your hospital, right?

Dr. Wu: Right, but you should contact us early.

Investigator: How early do we need to contact you? How long will it take before getting admitted into your hospital?

Dr. Wu: A bed can only be assigned the same day when a patient gets discharged. That cannot be arranged in advance. You need to come over early, along with the files.

Investigator: Great, I will bring you the medical records, all right? Thank you so much, thank you, Dr. Wu.

Dr. Wu: You're welcome.

Investigator: Ah. All right, bye!
