**Summary**

1. Our hospital generally has relatively abundant liver sources.
2. Not almost every day, but we basically have (liver sources) almost every month. In the fastest cases, we basically have organs every week.
3. If you come here to register, maybe a liver source will become available immediately. But the surgery can be done at least three days later.

**Translation**

Feng Zhendong: Hi, greetings!

Investigator: Hi greetings! Is this the PLA No. 107 Hospital's Organ Transplantation Center? Is this the Liver Transplantation Ward Office?

Feng Zhendong: Yes, yes.

Investigator: Greetings. I want to ask about something. I have a relative, who needs a liver transplant. His tissue typing and other (tests) have all been done. I am calling a few hospitals to find out which hospital is fast, and we will get it done there. I am not sure about your hospital, if the tissue typing and the rest have already been done ...

Feng Zhendong: What blood type?

Investigator: Ah?

Feng Zhendong: What blood type?

Investigator: Ah, blood type B.

Feng Zhendong: Blood type B.

Investigator: Yes.

Feng Zhendong: Then you have to get registered now.

Investigator: Yes, I want to ask, if we need to bring the patient over or bring his file first, his medical records.

Feng Zhendong: Just bring his file over.

Investigator: Oh, if the registration is okay, in the fastest case, how long do we have to wait?

Feng Zhendong: It depends on if we have the liver source. If you had called earlier, then we would have had it today.

Investigator: What does it mean that if I had called earlier?

Feng Zhendong: It means that I would have done it for you today.

Investigator: Ah, is that so? That means...

Feng Zhendong: Today...

Investigator: So it can be done quickly, right?

Feng Zhendong: Right.

Investigator: So they have a friend that recommended...a classmate recommended that we go to the military hospitals, saying that your hospital does a good job and also quickly. So I think, yes.

Feng Zhendong: Because our hospital generally has relatively abundant liver sources, many donated organs. So our liver sources are relatively abundant.

Investigator: Ah, ah, so within half a month, a week...

Feng Zhendong: What is his illness?

Investigator: He has late-stage liver cirrhosis.

Feng Zhendong: Late stage liver cirrhosis?

Investigator: Yes, yes.

Feng Zhendong: No tumor or such things, right?

Investigator: No, no.

Feng Zhendong: That is quite good. Then you come over to register, it will be relatively...

Investigator: Registration means waiting in line, right?

Feng Zhendong: Yes. It would be good if you had called last week.

Investigator: Is that so?

Feng Zhendong: We would have had it today.

Investigator: Ah.

Feng Zhendong: It is...

Investigator: So almost every day you have (organs). Whether it matches or not is another issue. Is that what you mean?

Feng Zhendong: Not almost every day, but we basically have (organs) almost every month.

Investigator: Ah, every month.

Feng Zhendong: Yes, in the fastest cases, we basically have organs every week.

Investigator: Ah, that's fine. So if we are lucky, maybe we can get it done on the same day or the next day. That is also possible.

Feng Zhendong: Yes, if you come here to register, maybe a liver source will become available immediately. But the surgery can be done at least three days later. It cannot be done as soon as you come over.

Investigator: Doing it after three days is also fine. That is quick enough. Okay, I see. Okay, then I will bring his medical records.

Feng Zhendong: Where is he from?

Investigator: He is from Liaoyang. But he does business in your area. He is there, his friends are all there. So he does not want to come back. So he will get it done there.

Feng Zhendong: That's fine. Tell him to come over.

Investigator: Sure. Getting a bed won't be an issue. If he has the surgery, he does not have to wait for a bed, right?

Feng Zhendong: Right, right. For such illnesses, we make arrangements directly.

Investigator: Military hospitals are not the same (as civilian hospitals) after all. Okay, okay, so doctor, how should I address you, if we come to look for you?

Feng Zhendong: Feng Zhendong.

Investigator: What is your last name?

Feng Zhendong: My last name is Feng, the most populous surname in Liaoning Province.

Investigator: You are surnamed Feng?

Feng Zhendong: Yes, yes.

Investigator: What is your first name? How should I address you?

Feng Zhendong: Feng Zhendong.

Investigator: Feng Zhendong?

Feng Zhendong: Yes.

Investigator: Zhen as in the word "zhenhan"?

Feng Zhendong: Zhen as in "zhenxing zhonghua". Dong as in "dongfeng".

Investigator: Ah, Dong as in "dongfang".

Feng Zhendong: Yes.

Investigator: Mr. Feng Zhendong. That is good. Okay, then I will come look for you.

Feng Zhendong: Okay, just call this phone number.

Investigator: Okay, that is fine.

Feng Zhendong: Hmm.

Investigator: Okay, thanks. Good. Thank you.
