Summary

1. You first need to go to the 12th floor of No. 2 Building and find Professor Liang Simin to get registered.
2. It costs around 300,000 yuan for a kidney transplant.
3. There is a shortage of beds.
4. Anyway, 17 cases have been done so far this year. That's all I can tell you.
5. He's the one in charge of this area at our hospital.
6. I can't give you his cell phone number. You'll have to go find him at the inpatient service.
7. It normally takes around two weeks to get discharged.
8. I have been here for more than a dozen years.

Translation

Investigator: Hello?

Nurse: Hello.

Investigator: Hi, how are you?

Nurse: Hi.

Investigator: Sorry to bother you at night. Is this the First Affiliated Hospital of

Chongqing Medical University?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Are you at Kidney Transplant Inpatient Service?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Oh, I'd like to consult with you then. One of my relatives, my brother in law, would like to go to your hospital. Do you have any available beds there?

Nurse: You need to check with Dr. Liang first. Find Professor Liang first.

Investigator: Do you mean Professor Liang Simin?

Nurse: Yes. They will then inform you when it's to get hospitalized.

Investigator: For his surgery, he's got all his tests done at the other hospital. They said as long as you have a kidney organ source, then we could move ahead.

Nurse: Oh, you'll first need to go to the 12th floor of No. 2 Building and find Liang Simin to register. We'll have to wait until after registration to get to all other things, such as the kidney source, the surgery and so on.

Investigator: No. 2 Building, right?

Nurse: Surgical Urology on the 12th floor of No. 2 Building.

Investigator: When is he available?

Nurse: He is available Monday through Friday. But he has surgeries to do on Wednesdays, which means it's not easy to find him on Wednesdays. Besides, he comes to his clinic on Tuesdays. Anyway, except for Wednesdays, he's available during normal business hours.

Investigator: So he's available during office hours. But could it be possible that he does a surgery every day?

Nurse: He doesn't do surgery every day. When you get to the nurses' station, you just tell them you want to have a kidney transplant looking for Liang Simin. Then they will find him for you.

Investigator: Oh, I got it. Then do you know roughly how much it is to replace a kidney?

Nurse: Ah, it's around 300,000 yuan. I mean roughly.

Investigator: They said that a little over 200,000 yuan could pretty much cover it. Generally speaking, how long would it take for a patient to get discharged after his surgery under normal conditions?

Nurse: It would take about two weeks normally.

Investigator: So do you have a shortage of beds at the inpatient service right now?

Nurse: We're at nearly full capacity now.

Investigator: Ah...so, we'll wait till an organ is available to get admitted into your hospital, and can have the surgery done in one to two days after admission, right?

Nurse: Right, right. The surgery can be done in one to two days.

Investigator: So I've heard from my friends that you have done a better job and performed larger quantities than others. Well, if this is the case, how many surgeries can you do in a month?

Nurse: It is not certain, depending on the kidney sources and their availability. Anyway, 17 cases have been done so far this year. That's all I can tell you.

Investigator: Oh, that is not few at all. When did your hospital start doing organ transplants? It's been more than a dozen years, right?

Nurse: Anyway, they had been doing it when I came to work at this division. I've been here for over a dozen years.

Investigator: My friend recommended your hospital. He said Liang Simin has done quite a lot of cases with more experience and skills.

Nurse: He's the one in charge of this area at our hospital.

Investigator: Oh, so Professor Liang Simin is in charge of this area, right?

Nurse: Uh.

Investigator: Oh, so for things like admission and kidney sources, he's the one to contact in any case, right?

Nurse: Right, right. He's the person to talk to.

Investigator: Oh, could you give me his cell phone number then?

Nurse: I can't do that. You'll have to go find him at the inpatient service.

Investigator: Oh, I can only find him there?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Oh, alright. Thank you very much.

Nurse: Not at all.

Investigator: Then I will find him directly.

Nurse: Okay.

Investigator: Okay, thank you so much. Good bye.
