#### Summary

1. It is possible to get it done in a week or two.
2. If there are no problems with the donor and test data, it can be done very quickly as well.
3. Whether it is quick or not depends on the patient's condition, the physical conditions of the two persons involved, and the condition of the liver function.
4. Once he's actually admitted here into our hospital, all problems can be resolved.

#### Translation

Nurse: Hello! This is Hepatobiliary Surgery.

Investigator: Uh, hello! This is Hepatobiliary Surgery of the People's Hospital of Xinjiang Autonomous Region, right?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Hey, hello, I am looking for Ning Na. May I talk to her?

Nurse: Ning Na, she's gone to a meeting.

Investigator: Ah, here's my situation. I called this number and talked to someone the other day. He told me that Ning Na is the contact person I need to get in touch with.

Nurse: You have to make an appointment with the doctor in advance.

Investigator: He said to me that day, "If lucky, sometimes you can get it done within a month or even within two weeks." What is your situation now?

Nurse: Are you talking about liver transplantation?

Investigator: Ah, right, right.

Investigator: Because he said that here at your hospital, if lucky, it can be done very quickly, sometimes even within one or two weeks. (Nurse: Yes, right.) Ah, it is possible to get it done in a week or two weeks, right? Then I will...

Nurse: Yes. It can be done very quickly if the tissue typing has no problems.

Investigator: Oh, do you think you can certainly get it arranged within one to two weeks?

Nurse: That depends on the patient's condition. Other factors include the physical conditions of these two persons, the liver function (Investigator: Oh), and test arrangements, etc. At our hospital, all tests can be arranged very quickly.

Investigator: That is to say, if everything goes well, if his liver tissue typing, blood type and everything else match well, then it can be done within two weeks, right?

Nurse: That's right. Would you please write down Ning Na's phone number?

Investigator: Ah?

Nurse: Write down Ning Na's phone number.

Investigator: Oh, write down Ning Na's phone number. Okay, go ahead, ah...

Nursing: 18 and four nines.

Investigator: Uh, 189999, okay.

Nurse: 41314

Investigator: 41314, right?

Nurse: Right.

Investigator: Oh, 18...

Nurse: She will tell you exactly a general timeline. Once a bed is available and arranged for you, you can come over.

Investigator: Well, that is to say, if it's quick, two weeks, if lucky, it can be done in two weeks, and in any case, it won't exceed one month, right? We just hope...

Nurse: You'll just need to have the patient go through all his tests, such as his blood test. After they're done and you decide to come, then we can say...right now, you just want to ask me about an approximate timing for taking a leave (for the surgery), right?

Investigator: That's right, right.

Nursing: As I said, it takes about two weeks. To get all his tests done, it takes two weeks. If a donor is available, it will be very quick! So you make sure to make an appointment with Ning Na, just talk to Ning Na, let her tell someone to make the arrangement for his bed, then he can get his tests done. After that, once the donor and recipient all work out well here, the doctor's schedule also needs to be looked at. Then depending on the doctor's availability, it can be done very soon.

Investigator: Okay. May I ask your surname? Your last name?

Nurse: My...my surname is Liu. Once he's actually admitted here into our hospital, all problems can be resolved.

Investigator: Everything can be resolved, right?

Nurse: More details can't be talked over the phone, right? So you can only get to know something in general.

Investigator: That's fine. Then, I'll talk to Ning Na. She's responsible for arranging hospitalization, etc. That's fine, (I'll call) that 18999 number.

Nurse: Let's double check that number.

Investigator: Okay, that's 1899941314, right?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Okay, okay, that's fine. Thank you, Ms. Liu!

Nurse: You're welcome!
