Summary

1. Right now, liver transplants are done mostly by Zuo Shi.
2. Zuo Shi is responsible for the liver transplantation here. He is the vice president of the Affiliated Hospital of Guizhou Medical University. He also offers the special need clinic.
3. Liver sources can possibly be found in a few days.
4. Investigator: Can a liver donor be found in a month or half a month?
Nurse: Yes...possibly also...but it's hard to say that you will come across such an opportunity this time.
5. Hepatology Surgery has a team doing liver transplants. President Zuo is responsible for this team now.

Translation

Investigator: Hello. Is this Hepatology Surgery of the Affiliated Hospital at Guiyang Medical University?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Ah, so can I talk to Professor Sun?

Nurse: Who?

Investigator: Sun Chengyi, Professor Sun.

Nurse: Professor Sun does not quite come to the inpatient service unit any more.

Investigator: Why doesn't he come to the inpatient service often? So when can I find him usually?

Nurse: We... (asking a colleague nearby: He does not quite come to the inpatient service unit?) He does not quite come to the inpatient service unit usually. If you look for him, at his office, basically he does not quite come.

Investigator: He's not been seen there. So then, let me ask you a question, as it's not easy for me to make this call. Let me ask a question. So our Professor Sun, he does liver transplants. Because I have a relative, who's been diagnosed with cirrhosis.

Nurse: Maybe you can directly make an appointment with Prof. Sun at the outpatient clinic. He has a clinic available for patients with special needs on Mondays.

Investigator: I just want to inquire about the situation. If it does not work for next Monday, I will look for him at another time. Could you tell me about your hospital? Because now my relative is quite young, at the Provincial Hospital over there, he's got his tests, such as his tissue typing, done already. He's been just waiting for a liver donor!

Nurse: Regarding that, they have people dedicated to liver transplantation. It all depends on his own condition. As for whether it can be done or not, I suggest that you make an appointment with Professor Sun Chengyi at the special need clinic, or with Professor Zuo Shi, President Zuo there. Either one will do.

Investigator: Or with whom else? Other than President Sun Chengyi, what was the name for the other one?

Nurse: Zuo Shi, President Zuo.

Investigator: Zuo is as in "Zuoyou". And then?

Nurse: Yes, Shi as in "Shitou".

Investigator: Zuo Shi. He also does liver transplants?

Nurse: Yes, most of the liver transplants here are done by him.

Investigator: Oh, it's Zuo Shi who does that?

Nurse: Yes, he is now responsible for the liver transplantation here. He is the vice president of our hospital. You can also make an appointment with him at the special need clinic.

Investigator: Ah, on which days does President Zuo come to the clinic?

Nurse: It seems like on Mondays.

Investigator: They both come to the clinic on Mondays? Both President Sun and President Zuo are available there on Mondays?

Nurse: Special need clinics are mostly on Mondays.

Investigator: Is it possible to find a liver donor and get the operation done in a month or half a month?

Nurse: That could happen, but it's hard to say if you will come across such an opportunity, since a liver donor comes by suddenly.

Investigator: En, I know. I believe that with good luck, he can get it done in a month or half a month.

Nurse: It all happens suddenly. Some can get one in a few days, but some have to go home and wait for it.

Investigator: Ah, usually patients wait here in the queue. So they wait in the queue, and get notified by telephone. Is that so?

Nurse: Ah, yes, yes. If you get him registered, all the detailed arrangements will be made for him, because, but now President Zuo is responsible for the liver transplantation team in the Hepatology Surgery. They have such a process...I don't know how they'll handle his tissue typing or how they'll notify you. They have a team on liver transplantation.

Investigator: Oh, there is such a team for liver transplantation?

Nurse: En, yes.

Investigator: So I'm wondering, as you work here at the inpatient service unit, do you have many beds? Isn't it true that if we get him registered here, then we can get him transferred over quickly?

Nurse: Oh, as for these things, such as when he should come see a doctor, or whether he needs to be transferred over, President Zuo will make the arrangements for your patient. For those patients for liver transplants, all things are arranged by them. I don't know how such arrangements will be made for your patient. For hospitalization, there is Floor 18, because we're here in the Second Section of the Inpatient Service Unit. There is the First Section specifically serving patients for liver transplants.

Investigator: Oh. How long usually have the doctors, like President Zuo, been doing it? How many cases can they do a year at your hospital? How are their skills? There are no problems, right?

Nurse: This year they must have done a few dozens of cases. For details, please bring the patient to the clinic. Every week President Zuo comes to the clinic.

Investigator: Ah, so you said this year a few dozens of cases have been done. Then he's done it for many years?

Nurse: Ah, yes. That is true. He's done it for many years. For details, please bring the patient over to get an assessment when the time comes.

Investigator: Oh! Okay, okay. Thank you very much. Good. I will let you get back to your work.
