Summary

1. We do it whenever we have an operation to do here.
2. No doctors will answer the phone. They've all gone to an operation.
3. Today there is a kidney transplant operation.
4. Investigator: Are there kidney transplant patients in your hospital now?
Nurse: Yes. There are both kidney and liver transplant patients.
5. With good luck, it can be done in a month.

Translation

Nurse: Hello, Transplantation!

Investigator: Hi, hello. Is this Chinese People's Liberation Army No. 923 Hospital?

Nurse: Yeah, yes.

Investigator: Hi, hello. Is this the kidney transplant office? I have a relative who wants to get a kidney transplant at your place.

Nurse: Yeah, yeah, this is the nurses' station of the transplant program.

Investigator: You're at the Nurses' station. My relative wants to get a kidney transplant at your place....

Nurse: What is the transplantation for?

Investigator: He suffers from a kidney issue, from uremia.

Nurse: Is he doing hemodialysis or abdominal dialysis?

Investigator: Hemodialysis.

Nurse: Hemodialysis. How many times per week?

Investigator: He should be doing it once a week, sometimes about twice a week.

Nurse: On which day(s) of the week does he do it?

Investigator: Ah, he seems to be...that is to say, he does it once more if it gets serious, and does it once less if it is not serious. So, he does not have a fixed schedule.

Nurse: Ah. Here is the situation, if you want to get hospitalized, first you need to register for an appointment at the clinic. After that, you will go through the hospitalization procedure. Afterwards, well, there will be some, a series of routine tests to follow.

Investigator: So after the tests are done, it means the tissue typing is done, which means we'll get in the queue, start to join the waiting list.

Nurse: Yes. When you come over, you'll join the waiting list.

Investigator: In that case, then, how long would be the wait time, in the quickest case?

Nurse: Well, I don't know about that specifically. It's hard to say, because there are many patients waiting here, and the tissue typing also depends on luck.

Investigator: So if somebody, somebody is really lucky, in the quickest case, can it be done in a month?

Nurse: Yes!

Investigator: In that case, if I bring the patient over, are your beds in tight supply? Can we get hospitalized when we arrive?

Nurse: Ah, yes. When you arrive, first, you must go through a nuclear acid test.

Investigator: Okay. Then I want to ask, are there kidney transplant patients in your hospital now?

Nurse: Yes. (Investigator: Ah) There are both kidney and liver transplant patients.

Investigator: Ah, you also do liver transplants? I have a friend who wants to have a liver transplant. He wants to get it done at a military hospital. So I will tell him to come here.

Nurse: Okay, no problem. Please come here first. Please come here. We will learn and analyze your case in details then.

Investigator: Fine. So, how many can you do at your hospital every year? Isn't it true that the more you do the better your skills become?

Nurse: Well, it's like this. You come over first, as the Second Affiliated Hospital also does the operations here. Please come here first, and we will then look into the specific situation with the doctors.

Investigator: So that means you can do it?

Nurse: We do it whenever we have an operation to do.

Investigator: So can you do 200 to 300 cases, or 100 to 200 cases a year?

Nurse: Now we cannot do as many as 100 to 200 cases.

Investigator: Ah, that's due to...?

Nurse: Like this year, we cannot do that many. Right, it's due to things such as the pandemic.

Investigator: You've been affected by the pandemic this year?

Nurse: Ah.

Investigator: So you can do 100 cases at least, right?

Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: About 100 cases?

Nurse: Certainly.

Investigator: Ah.

Nurse: We did that many in the past.

Investigator: Great.

Nurse: If there were no pandemic, we would have done that many.

Investigator: Well, if my friend wants to call and consult about a liver transplant, can he call this number?

Nurse: Well, for a liver transplant, please call the doctors' office. This is the nurses' station. Please ask him to call another number. Let me tell you the number.

Investigator: Then, please give it to me. Thank you.

Nurse: Uh. 2870635. If you call now, there are no doctors answering the phone. They are all gone for an operation. Today there is an operation, which the doctors have all gone to. So you'd better....

Investigator: Today there is a liver transplant operation there, right?

Nurse: No, there is a kidney transplant operation today. Please call in the evening, okay?

Investigator: You have another doctor, well...Chief Physician Wang Hongliang. Is he still with you?

Nurse: Yes, yeah. If you have his contact information, you can also contact him.

Investigator: I, I don't have his contact information. But I have a friend who got it done by him some time back. That's why I knew about him.

Nurse: Okay.

Investigator: So I can go there and directly look for him? Is that okay?

Nurse: Ah, ah. Okay, that's okay.

Investigator: Okay? Good.

Nurse: If you want to come, let's go from there when you get here. Okay?

Investigator: Good, good. Thank you. Thank you.
