

## South Central University XiangYa 2<sup>nd</sup> Hospital Liver Transplant Doctor

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Brief Content Summary:

- 1. In Hunan Province, our hospital did the highest number of liver transplants.
- 2. For sure a couple hundred cases this year. Nearly 20 cases alone last month.
- 3. It's about 10 cases for a so-so month.
- 4. Pretty much it's just XiangYa 2<sup>nd</sup> Hosptial doing the liver transplants in Hunan.
- 5. Waiting time can be long or short. Some came today and be done by tomorrow. Sometimes one can wait for liver, but some times it's waiting for patients.

**Recording Content** 

Investigator: How are you, can you hear me?

Doctor: Yes. What's up?

Investigator: Are you XiangYa 2<sup>nd</sup> Hospital Liver Transplant Department?

Doctor: Yes.

Investigator: Hi, I am from ChangSa. I'd like to ask if you are still doing liver transplant in your hospital.

Doctor: Yes.

Investigator: OK. So the hospital has been doing liver transplant till now, still?

Doctor: oh yes we are. Pretty much our hospital did the most transplants in ChangSa Hunan.

Investigator: The most? I hear about that from some friends. That's why I am calling. Did you do a lot of it? For Liver transplant?

Doctor: yes a lot indeed. We did more than 10 cases last month.

Investigator: for last month? How about this year? How many in total have you done liver transplant this year in total?

Doctor: This year? I am not sure about the actual number. It Should be over a hundred or 200 cases. Last month it was almost 20 cases.

Investigator: You mean last month?



Doctor: You can calculate yourself.

Investigator: I see, that means you average 20 cases each month then.

Doctor: better say mostly 10 cases in a so-so month.

Investigator: If you have a waiting queue, how long do I need to wait if I want to go back to do it?

Doctor: I can't say for sure. Because there are different liver types. We need to see the patient first.

Investigator: For B blood type?

Doctor: in General, in a small hospital, waiting time is not long. Sometimes the patient comes in today, an emergency procedure is done tomorrow, right?

Investigator: So, I should know you are doing the most cases. You have done 100 or 200 cases already this year, right?

Doctor: Yes

Investigator: OK I see.

Doctor: More or less average about 10 case per month. Nearly 100 cases now. It's about 8 months so far. OK about 100 cases now.

Investigator: Since you are doing many cases every year, also you have many donor organs. That's what other hospitals told me, that's why you are recommended to me. They say your hospital has more donors than other hospitals. Some times you have extras to support other hospitals. That's why I am calling you, maybe your waiting time is short.

Doctor: If you want to know details, or if you have friends want to know. You can register for an outpatient consultation. Calling on phone may not get you all the details. Somethings the expert needs to assess it. Our professor needs to assess it. He who will be doing the operation, you see? Even many of us lower-level doctors cannot give much inputs.

Investigator: ah, I see.

Doctor: I am just telling you that in Hunan, it's pretty much XiangYa 2<sup>nd</sup> Hosptial doing the liver transplant. Quantity-wise about 10 cases per month.

Investigator: OK, but at least 10 cases right?

Doctor: Yes.

Investigator: You said sometimes 20 cases, right?

Doctor: well, lets say usually about 10 cases. I didn't say at least. Pretty much sometime you wait of liver source, sometime it's waiting for the patient, such things hard to say.

Investigator: OK so if I come, do I look for you? May I inquire your name?

Doctor: You go ahead and register for the expert. It's OK if you just register at the General Outpatient Consultation.

Investigator: Is there a specific expert that I can register for?

Doctor: Si DongZhou, Si DongZhou. Or else you can come directly over to our General Surgery Building 8 Transplant Center Patient Ward. Come directly is fine.

Investigator: Mr. Si? Which Si?

Doctor: Si as the word in GongSi. Si DongZhou, OK. You can find the name in XiangYa 2<sup>nd</sup> Hospital. Look for his name in the General Surgery Department. You can see it, OK. It's fine either way.

Investigator: OK, OK, thank you very much.

Doctor: OK no problem. I am on duty now, so I better get going. Bye bye.
