Telephone content:

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Investigator: Hello, Doctor Wu. Happy Chinese New Year! You ARE Doctor Wu Jianyong, right? I would like to ask you something--I have a family member, I am a family member of a patient, he's my nephew who wants to do kidney transplant. Do you still do it there?

Doctor on duty: What, what's the situation? what's the situation?

Investigator: Oh, he used to have chronic nephritis, and he has been on dialysis for more than a year now. The

doctor here suggests that he have a kidney transplant?

Duty: Well, what, what then?

Investigator: Ah, what did you say?

Duty: What do you want?

Investigator: Oh, he wants to do a kidney transplant, or he wants a kidney change. He wants a kidney change, so

he wants a kidney transplant. Do you still do it there?

Doctor on duty: You can come over for an exam...and then we'll talk.

Investigator: Uh, so you can still do it here, have you done any this year?

Doctor on duty: What? No.

Investigator: You haven't started this year?

Doctor on duty: Not yet.

Investigator: Oh, you haven't. When we got there, how long would we have to wait?

Doctor on duty: Up to five years.

Investigator: Then you...then your hospital no longer does it, sort of speak, right?

Doctor on duty: There are a lot of people waiting.

Investigator: There are a lot of people waiting, you say? So you...you haven't done it

Doctor on duty: Right

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Investigator: Some people suggested that I..., because I believe in your hospital, because a friend of mine did it in the past, and the result was not bad, so he recommended to me, but some people suggested that I contack more hospitals, ha, some hospitals do it very quickly, and some hospitals do it slowly. If your hospital does it quickly, then of course I hope to do it here.

Doctor on duty: I... I... we have done a lot, but there are more people waiting.

Investigator: There are a lot of people waiting, right?

Doctor on duty: Yes, if you do very few now, and there may not be many people waiting.

Investigator: Wow, you...because you have done a lot here, you have a lot of experience, and the result is good too, so I am still willing to do it here. You said that you have not started this year, so how long will I have to wait?

Doctor on duty: We now have more than 2,000 people waiting.

Investigator: More than 2,000 people! How long then will it take before these 2,000 plus people can have their transplants done?

Doctor on duty: Uh, on average, it takes five years.

Investigator: Wow, the patient will have died, he'll be done. If you will start to do it this year, and if you do a lot, then I will have hope.

Doctor on duty: It will take five years on average, because we do a lot, especially this year... there are a lot. Other hospitals may not do so many, so the patient probably won't wait that long.

Investigator: Then you, you do a lot, so how many can you do every month? Can you do a lot? Can you do ten, or twenty cases?

Doctor on duty: But in Guangzhou, there is this Sun Yat-sen Hospital, you can also have it done in Guangzhou.

Investigator: But I... I am too far away, because I am in Jiangsu, I can't travel so far to do it.

Doctor on duty: Are you in Jiangsu?

Investigator: Ah.

Doctor on duty: Why is your phone number from Hong Kong?

Investigator: (Explanation) I am not from Hong Kong, but from Changzhou.

Doctor on duty: Oh...

Investigator: Because a friend of mine did it at your place, and he said the result was very good, so I thought since someone recommended...of course, I believed in this friend, so I contacted you.

Doctor on duty: Uh, come here, after you... we...you come over and we'll talk.

Investigator: So, you are still doing it now, that is, you have been doing it all the time, is that so?

Doctor on duty: Yes, yes, yes. come over.

Investigator: So am I right to say you have already started to do it this year, did you start to do it in 2016?

Doctor on duty: We started in 2016, but we haven't started since the Spring Festival.

Investigator: Huh?

Doctor on duty: We haven't started since the Spring Festival, but we'd been doing it before the Spring Festival.

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Investigator: Oh, before the Spring Festival, you had already started to do it... that is to say, since 2016, you have been doing it. How many cases have you done?

Doctor on duty: We have done about 20 cases.

Investigator: so many, you could do more than 20 cases in a month. Of course, compared with other hospitals... I asked them. Some only do a few cases, and some do a dozen cases, which is too little...

Doctor on duty: Right, let me tell you, you can come over and take a look... You should come here... Let's talk... Let's find a way...

Investigator: Oh, then what you are saying is, it means that you have already done more than 20 cases in January, which means that you have done more than other hospitals.

Doctor on duty: That's right...
