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Nightlights:

1. We are still doing it. One case was done on the day the phone call was made.

2. A total of seven kidney transplants were done in nine days January 1 through 9.

3. Donations are local, and the doctors who perform liver transplants pick the donated organs.

Telephone recording snippet:

Investigator: Is this Dr. Guo? I am a family member of a patient. Do you still perform kidney transplant operations there? Doctor: Yes, we do.

Investigator: Will the patient have to wait for long once there? Doctor: There is no uniform standard for this.

Investigator: How many cases have you done this year? Doctor: This year? 2016? Six cases were done the day before yesterday, and one case was done today, (total) seven cases.
