- 1. Quite a few were done last year;
- 2. Many hospitals are doing kidney transplants, but the more proficient one is the China Western;
- 3. The one responsible is Dean Zhou DingHua. For surgery, they have a special kidney transplant group;
- 4. The one responsible now is professor Li ChaoYang, he is the chief.
- 5. Dean Zhu TianHua is in charge of the transplant center, but he is on the administrative side. For other businesses, it possibly is still chief ChaoYang.

Content of Recording:

Investigator: Hello are you Doctor Li, Dr. Li ZhengKai? Yeah, I am from 316, I'd like to know where you are?

Do you still perform kidney transplant? Hello?

Doctor: Liver transplant?

Investigator: Yeah, Liver transplant. Do you still do it?

Doctor: Oh, Liver transplant, yes, we do.

Investigator: Do you?

Doctor: Yeah. But we have separated the Hepatobiliary and General Surgery. Liver transplant is done over

there with Hepatobiliary.

Investigator: Where are you at?

Doctor: I am with General Surgery now.

Investigator: Oh, so at General Surgery, you don't do it then.

Doctor: No, we don't do it at our department. Now the Hepatobiliary department is doing it.

Investigator: Hepatobiliary is doing it, so they do liver transplant? I have, there is a military leader we need to

send over for it.

Doctor: But you have to have a liver donor.

Investigator: Yes, there is liver source. But, what is you liver source?

Doctor: You have to wait for it.

Investigator: Waiting?

Doctor: For type matching, have to wait.

Investigator: So, this year you haven't done any? For 2016?

Doctor: For 2016 we haven't started doing it. No, no type matching. Didn't get any Liver donor. Main problem

is Liver source

Investigator: Mainly because of lack of liver source.

Doctor: Where are you from?

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Investigator: I am from 316. Well, Did you do any last year? What is the status?

Doctor: Quite a few were done last year.

Investigator: So last year, did you do a few hundred? I see that a lot is done over at Military Police 309.

Doctor Li at 309 said to go ask 2nd Artillary. They are doing quite a bit, but the queue there is too long at 309.

Doctor: No, no, we didn't do a few hundred. But should have a few dozen.

Investigator: OK. Just that you haven't started doing it this year.

Doctor: A few hundred? No, there aren't many liver sources for liver transplants. It's not possible to have that many liver sources.

Investigator: But some hospitals have done it. The Military Police Hospital did more than 300 cases.

Doctor: It's not possible to have done 300 cases.

Investigator: They said themselves.

Doctor: No, not possible. Think about it, one liver transplant per day, it's a joke. Even our gastrointestinal surgeries are not so numerous. How is it possible to do one liver transplant each day. No rest the whole year? There are 365 days, almost one liver transplant each day, not possible.

Investigator: Well, maybe it's just that you don't do as many as they do. For what you do, you said....

Doctor: OK maybe. Anyway, over hear we can't do it. Even the most proficient Liver transplant center can't

do it. One liver transplant every day? can't do it.

Investigator: Where do you say is the most proficient? Which liver transplant center?

Doctor: For liver transplant?

Investigator: Yeah

Doctor: Many hospitals are doing liver transplant. But the most proficient one should be China Western.

Investigator: China Western?

Doctor: Yeah, China Western Hospital. They are very strong for liver transplant.

Investigator: Oh, it's so. But it is too far, too far over there. That.......

Doctor: Right, we are doing it also, but this thing, you kind of, every liver needs to be type matched. It has to

be registered, after registering.

Investigator: Last year, you did less than one hundred cases, a few dozen, then for you guys, the liver came

pretty fast?

Doctor: For the details I am not too clear, it all came from Dean Zhou DingHua, after that, for the operation,

they have a special liver transplant group. Currently it is there with Professor Li ChaoYang.

Investigator: Oh, I see. Were you part of the transplant surgery before?

Doctor: Yes, before the departments were separated, I was part of it. At that time, we were together, afterwards

we separated into Hepatobiliary and General Surgery, I went to General Surgery....

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Investigator: I see. Then you probably did a lot more. Then do you know about the liver sources?

Doctor: Not too clear even back then. It was usually messages from higher up. We just wait till it arrives, then

prepare for liver transplant. And that's

Investigator: I see you don't know where the liver comes from. Anyways you just do the operation after it

arrives. Could tell me who is in charge? I'd like to get in touch with him.

Doctor: Now the one in charge is Professor Li ChaoYang.

Investigator: So, he is the chief? Doctor: Yes, he is the chief.

Investigator: I thought you said it was Dr. Zhu?

Doctor: Yes, Dean Zhou DingHua is responsible for transplant center, but he is in charge of administrative

part. For other business, it's most likely still Chief Dr. ChaoYang.
