- 2. The organ sometimes are extracted at our hospital; some are from outside; it may come from any possible places.

Translation

Doctor: Hello?

Investigator: Hello. Is that Director Chen Xiaoping form the Liver Transplant Department of Tongji Hospital

affiliated to HUST?

Doctor: Hi. Who's that? Hello? Hello?...Hello?

Investigator: Hello. Director. The line was interrupted a bit just now.

Doctor: Hi. I am... I am... I am in the car. The signal in the car was not good.

Investigator: Okay. No wonder. I am calling... I have a relative. He will have liver transplant in your hospital. I would like to ask for your help to schedule (the sugery).

Doctor: Where is the patient?

Investigator: He is in Nanjing. He is 45 years old, blood type B. That...

Doctor: In Nanjing. Why doesn't he do it in Nanjing then?

Investigator: Well, they said the waiting time is long over there. And, and the source of liver is also... also cannot obtained. So I want to ask... as I know you do more (liver transplant). So I want to see whether you can do it earlier? So That's why.

Doctor: For sue you need to wait. I cannot say how long you need to wait because the (organs) are distributed systematically across the nation. I cannot say how long, but if you would like to come her, we can schedule it. However... however, that is not to say that if you come today, you can do it tomorrow. Well, no... it won't be that fast.

Investigator: Okay. Can you tell me usually, how long is your waiting time?

Doctor: It is hard to say. Because, because it is arranged based on the system.

Investigator: That is to say, if the physical examination finds (he is) qualified (for the organ transplant), if (the transplant)can be done, it can be done after the evaluation.

Doctor: Yeah. After the evaluation, (the transplant) can be done. Some... Sometimes it is fast, sometime it takes... it takes ten days to half a month.

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Investigator: Okay. If it is fast, how long does it take? It takes 10 days to half a month if it is slow. It is also fine to take 10 days to half a month.

Doctor: Ten days to half a month... the fastest...It will take a week or so the fastest.

Investigator: Okay. One week to 10 days or half a month. That is very.. that is very good.

Doctor: Then... That depends on... on your luck. Sometimes it... sometimes... sometimes he (the donor) matches him (the patient) it can be very fast; sometimes the waiting time is longer. It depends... the situation is different for each person, right?

Investigator: Then the fastest can be a week; it may take 10 days or half a month if it is slow, right? Doctor: Right.

Investigator: Then can you see when the patient can come over so you can take a look, Okay? We can take the material here.

Doctor: Let's see. You... by the time, for the specifics, just get in touch with the secretary. I will get you the phone number. Please get in touch with the secretary, Okay?

Investigator: Okay. That's fine. Then can you tell me the name of your secretary?

Doctor: Then...by the time, I will ask him to contact you... I ask him to contact you, Okay?

Investigator: Sure. Well, are the organs ... extracted simultaneously at your hospital? Or is it taken from outside?

Doctor: It may come from any possible places. Yeah.

Investigator: Okay. Then thank you. Okay. Goodbye.
