Summary

1. It depends on luck sometimes. Some may take one to two days, some take even three to five days, while some may take one to two weeks.
2. There are several donors with type O and A now, but no type B as well as AB.
3. The donors' organs are basically all our own.
4. We've done 165 cases last year.

Translation

Doctor: Hello.

Investigator: Hi, is this Director Wang Xin at the Affiliated Hospital of Qingdao University?

Doctor: Hey, speaking.

Investigator: Hi, hello. This call is from Beijing.

Doctor: Hey, how are you?

Investigator: Hello there. I have a relative in Qingdao who has chronic hepatitis B cirrhosis and is going to have a liver transplant.

Doctor: Hey, please go on.

Investigator: Could you schedule a liver transplant earlier over there?

Doctor: Uh, has he waited here already? Let me check the impatient..... is hospitalized in our hospital.

Investigator: Uh, let's say...how about making an appointment? I'll have him look for you directly for a checkup, ok?

Doctor: That'll work. Just have him call me. Type B should be okay and won't take too long. Type B is okay for now.

Investigator: Then how long is usually the wait time if the assessment is all right?

Doctor: Sometimes it depends on.....depends on luck, some some may take one to two days, some take even three to five days while some may take one to two weeks. Type B should be okay at this moment. I'll talk to those who in charge to take care of it...should bealso okay. Type B is not a particularly difficult one.

Investigator: That's fine. So it is as fast as one to two days and sometimes three to five days, right?

Doctor: Right, right. It depends on when it's available. Since it's like this, iff he is generally in a better shape, not the patient with liver failure, he'll just wait for the allocation from our center. Sometimes for those who are very severewith particularly high rating, he may probably get the distribution from the province. Uh, so he as you said he has had hepatitis B cirrhosis for a long time, his rating may not be very high, then he can just wait for our donor. Then because of the four blood types, well, for example, if there are probably



there are several donors now, but no type O at this moment, then we'll have to wait for the next type O, oh, no no, wait for type B, and then...

Investigator: Um.

Doctor: Only then can we arrange for him. You get what I mean?

Investigator: Ah, so what do you have now? What blood type do you have?

Doctor: There are now...may be several type O and A, but no type B as well as AB.

Investigator: Uh, the donor~

Doctor: If he is generally..... generally well, he certainly can make it. It's just the matter of luck luck depending on luck, and then the issue of how long to be done. So this aspect

Investigator: So generally speaking, is the wait time one to two weeks over there? It should be that long, right?

Doctor: Right, it should be about that.

Investigator: Um, about one to two weeks. All right then. It's still possible for one to two weeks, right?

Doctor: Uh, it's possible.

Investigator: Your....are your donors' organs excised and transplanted simultaneously at the hospital? Or are they from outside...

Doctor: It's all... all our own, basically all our own.

Investigator: It's all your own. How old are the donors generally...

Doctor: This....this...,this could be all ages.

Investigator: Ah, your....I know you have done quite a lot. How many cases have you done last year?

Doctor: We've done 165 cases last year.

Investigator: Ah?

Doctor: 165 cases.

Investigator: Ah, that sounds good, ah, very good. Well, appreciate it. I'll have the patient look for you directly, ok? All right. Thanks.

Doctor: Sure. Just have him give me a call.

Investigator: All right, all right.

Doctor: No problem.

Investigator: All right.

Doctor: Ok.

Investigator: Thanks.
