## Summary

1. The general waiting time in line is two to three months.

2. There should be no problem with the First Affiliated Hospital and the Second Affiliated Hospital of Zhejiang University. The waiting time with them is a bit faster than ours.

3. The organs are from our hospital, there are also ones from outside.

## Translation

Qi Haizhi: Yes!

Investigator: Hmm! Are you Director Qi Haizhi of the Transplantation Department at the Xiangya Second Hospital of Central South University?

Qi Haizhi: Ah, who is this?

Investigator: Well, I wanted to talk to you mainly because I have a relative in your area who needs a liver transplant. He has hepatitis and advanced liver cirrhosis. He needs a liver transplant. I want to ask you if your hospital can arrange it now? Are you doing this?

Qi Haizhi: Ah, we are doing this thing, this surgery, yes, yes. Which hospital does he (the patient) line up in?

Investigator: He (the patient) had queued up at the Zhejiang University Hospital and had an examination, but it seems that they can't arrange it there, so I was just asking...we wanted to ask a couple of more hospitals, and the main reason for that is, we wanted to have it done soon...

Qi Haizhi: Ah...this is his circumstance... he will be assigned to the hospital where you signed him up.

Investigator: He (the patient) is now, his condition is as follows: he has type B blood, is 45 years old, and now has moderate ascites. I just wanted to ask, if, in your view, his medical files and appraisal show he is fit for surgery, how long will it take before a surgery can be arranged? How long does it usually take?

Qi Haizhi: Ah, for him (the patient), it depends on how long his illness can, can, and last. If it is urgent, if he can't wait for one or two months, that will be very dangerous.

Investigator: Now his condition is serious, and we wanted to have it done sooner. Qi Haizhi: In Zhejiang...in which hospital in Zhejiang is he lining up?

Investigator: Zhejiang University Hospital, Zhejiang University Hospital... Qi Haizhi: Which hospital of Zhejiang University is it? There are the first and second affiliated hospitals.

Investigator: We've been to both the first and the second hospitals for line-up. Qi Haizhi: That should be no problem, their waiting time is shorter than ours.

Investigator: Ah, no, they don't seem to be doing well recently...



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Qi Haizhi: No, they are faster than us. They...because they only have two hospitals for this surgery, two or three hospitals for this surgery. There are 10 transplant hospitals, but there are 4 or 5 hospitals for this surgery, so it is hard to say which hospital will be able to get it done sooner.

Investigator: So now, if we come to your place to wait in line, it will be (waiting) for two or three months, is it usually like this?

Qi Haizhi: Ah, yes, yes, yes.

Investigator: Then your organs are from your hospital...does it mean that the organs are harvested in your hospital, or are they taken from outside and then brought back?

Qi Haizhi: That depends, that depends... there are also those brought to us from outside. If you want to come, just come and line up, okay?

Investigator: Alright, when do you think we should come to the clinic to see you? Or where can I find you? Qi Haizhi: No, just go to the ward to (see me). Just come to the ward.

Investigator: That's great, great. Qi Haizhi: Okay, okay, okay.
