Subject(s): Professor Wang Meng with Liver Transplant in the First Hospital of Jilin University

Summary

1. If the assessment is suitable, wait one or two months before a surgery can be arranged.
2. Organs are generally obtained in our hospital, and the provincial Red Cross Society arranges them.
3. Over 100 liver transplants were performed last year.

Translation

Investigator: Hey, you are Professor Wang Meng with the Transplantation Department of the First Hospital of Jilin University, right?

Wang Meng: Ah.

Investigator: Hello, I am calling from Beijing. I have a relative in Jilin, and I am asking Professor Wang to help arrange a liver transplant surgery. I don't know what's the situation in your place now, but he...he has advanced liver cirrhosis, hepatitis B, advanced liver cirrhosis, and type B blood, he's 45 years old.

Wang Meng: It depends on his blood type. When the time comes...when the times comes, we have to check him up, um, we have to... we have to check him up. Tomorrow...tomorrow let him call me, let the patient call me.

Investigator: Ah, tomorrow you are... When will you attend the outpatient clinic or be in the ward? Shall we ask the patient to come see you?

Wang Meng: Just ask him to call me tomorrow, and I will ask about his condition then.

Investigator: I have a few questions now, that is, if the assessment is suitable and a surgery can be performed, how long will it take before a surgery can be arranged?

Wang Meng: Ah, it varies, it varies, it'll take... two months, one to two months.

Investigator: Ah, one to two months?

Wang Meng: Yes.

Investigator: Ah, one to two months, that's okay. And your organs, are they harvested in your hospital... done simultaneously with transplant surgery? Or did you bring it back from other hospitals? Generally speaking.

Wang Meng: They are generally obtained in our hospital...our hospital, and the provincial...provincial Red Cross arranges them.

Investigator: They are all from your hospital, yes, your hospital takes them?

Wang Meng: Yes.

Investigator: The organs are from this hospital, right?

Wang Meng: Yes.

Investigator: How many cases of liver transplantation did your hospital do last year?

Wang Meng: More than 100.



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Investigator: Ah, more than 100 cases were done last year?

Wang Meng: Yes.

Investigator: And that's a lot.

Wang Meng: Okay, okay.

Investigator: Okay, that's it for now. Okay, thank you.
