Investigation Recording 6, “We have abundant donors now and can select young and healthier ones. But in the future, we don’t know if things are still like this.”

Subject of Investigation: Chen Yongfeng from Liver Transplantation Department of Zhengzhou People’s Hospital

Chen Yongfeng said that on the day of the phone investigation, two operations were performed, one donor was 16 years old, and the other was 24 years old. He said, “We all selected people less than 40 years old. Donors can be found within a week.”

Chen: Hello.

Investigator: Hi, Doctor Chen, Doctor Chen Yongfeng, hi, good evening. I was referred to you by the “Liver Transplantation Recipient Society”. I have a relative who needs an organ transplant. This is not easy. So I want to get some information from you. Can this hospital carry out liver transplantation?

Chen: Our hospital can perform liver transplantation. We are the best in Henan Province. Today we did other operations, which are two liver transplantation operations.

Investigator: Two operations today, is that right?

Chen: That’s right.

Investigator: Let me try. I have a friend, not me, who just called Doctor Yuan, you know, Yuan Zhenhua. He said he did it today.

Chen: Yuan Zhenhua, yes, yes, yes. I also heard from Doctor Yuan that there is a patient, probably from Anyang, right?

Investigator: It’s not Anyang, its Anhui, Anhui.

Chen: From Anhui.

Investigator: Maybe he got it wrong. From Anhui.

Chen: From Anhui.

Investigator: Right, Right, He has Blood Type B, and he’s over 60 years old. He is my relative, not for me, for my relative. A female cousin of mine contacted him, and then told me that it could be done. I want to get some information. So you said today you did two operations. The donors, are they sourced locally? Or from other places? How is the quality for (the donors from) other places?

Chen: If you prepare to do liver transplantation, you prepare early, and the time will be sufficient. We can select a healthier and a little younger liver for you. Today we just did one operation. It was a blood type A (donor). This patient has the same (blood type). The

donor is B. So today they told me that the donor has Blood Type B. Doctor Yuan said a call from Anhui told us the patient's blood type is B. I asked why not call today? Today we have a 16-year-old donor with cerebral hemorrhage. He is only 16 years 3 days old. His liver, over 700 grams of it were harvested, and it was less than 800 grams. The young donor is very good. A very good liver. It was harvested at 9 o'clock.

Investigator: 16 years old, he was so young and got cerebral hemorrhage at this young age. His cerebral blood vessels must have congenital deformity. Well, well, it was like this. You did two operations, indeed.

Chen: If you don't believe me, you can check. There is a name, Chen Guoyong. He is our president and our department director, too. Our liver transplant surgeries are all done by him. We did several more operations recently. Two operations have been done between a husband and wife with different blood types. You can check it out. These are media reports. It's also reported by the CCTV. The operations have absolutely no problem. You can trust us 100%.

Investigator: So usually for donor (organs), do your surgeons excise them by themselves, or others excise them and deliver them to you?

Chen: We harvest the organs by ourselves. First, we must guarantee the donor organ's quality. Because we do the operations, we want to do this operation, we need to show the patients. For every operation, that is, donor organ excision, we need to confirm (the quality) ourselves. Every day we evaluate the patient, and then do the related examinations. So after we do the thorough evaluation and exams, then we harvest the organs. After we harvest them, we would have a quality evaluation. After the evaluation, if a transplant can be done, then we would do it.

Investigator: Where do you harvest the donor (organs)?

Chen: If there are an (organ) donation, they would tell us. After they tell us, sometimes we go there, (we excise organs) locally, and sometimes at our hospital.

Investigator: So today you did two operations. One (donor) was 16 years old, and you did two or three operations today. Two operations today.

Chen: Two operations, two operations. One of them was just like what you said.

Investigator: How old was the other one? Over 20 years old? Your donors were quite young. The qualities should be good. So young.

Chen: There are also older ones. Say, over 30 years, over 40 years. But for these donors, we have to control (the organ quality).

Investigator: Oh. So for donors over 40 years old, usually you will not take them. Usually under 40 years old.

Chen: Usually we will not consider them, usually we will not consider them.

Investigator: You will not consider them. You want donors in their 30s or 20s. You guys are quite different.

Chen: There are bodies that are over that age.

Investigator: Yes, go ahead.

Chen: Because now, I guess later on, the donor supply will become tighter and tighter. There will be more and more patients needing transplantation. So I guess later on there will be no room for selection. Now we still have room to select, but I guess later on, if you want to wait, you will lose the opportunity.

Investigator: That's right. So now how much for a transplant surgery? I almost forgot to ask.

Chen: It depends, different cases have different rates.

Investigator: So let me ask you, roughly how long is the wait time? Let's say the patient comes from Anhui, roughly how long is his wait time?

Chen: Usually about a week.

Investigator: You will find a donor in about a week, usually a week. Let me see if there is anything else. OK. I will contact you then.

Chen: Okay, sure.

Investigator: I will contact you. Thank you.
